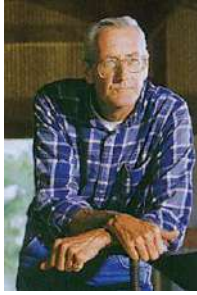

Contest Shoe List

Student Division (less than 3 years of professional experience):

- Class 1 - Eagle Eye with a neutral keg shoe
- Class 2 - Pair of hinds with square toe, quarter clips, and extended heels
- Class 3 - Shoe a dead leg with a neutral keg shoe
 - Specimen shoe - shape a neutral shoe to the opposite front foot with a rocker toe and quarter clips
- Class 4 - Two-man class = open competitor paired with intermediate/student; shoe TBA
- Class 5 - Little shoe class = produce pair of shoes that will be smaller than 2 ½ inches in length (open to all divisions)

Intermediate Division:

- Class 1 - Eagle Eye with ¼" x ¾" plain stamped, 6 nail holes, center punched
- Class 2 - Pair of 13 ½" of ¼" x ¾" front fullered straight bar shoes, 6 nail holes
- Class 3 - Live shoeing = shoe 1 foot with 3/8" x ¾" steel, plain stamped, 6 nail holes
 - Specimen shoe - hind shoe from 12" of 3/8" x 1" steel, fullered, toe clipped, 6 nail holes
- Class 4 – Two-man class = open competitor paired with intermediate/student; shoe TBA
- Class 5 - Little shoe class = produce pair of shoes that will be smaller than 2 ½ inches in length (open to all divisions)

Open Division:

- Class 1 - Eagle Eye with 3/8" x ¾" fullered, egg barn, 6 nail holes, center punched
- Class 2 - Pair of 14" of 3/8" x ¾" front, deep seated, fullered straight bar shoes, 6 nail holes, quarter clipped
- Class 3 - Live shoeing = shoe 1 foot with 3/8" x ¾" steel, fullered, toe clipped, 6 nail holes
 - Specimen shoe - hind shoe with 13" of ½" x 1", double caulk, plain stamped with a toe clip
- Class 4 - Two-man class = open competitor paired with intermediate/student; shoe TBA
- Class 5 - Little shoe class = produce pair of shoes that will be smaller than 2 ½ inches in length (open to all divisions)

Entry fees:

- Student division: \$20 per class with 50% payback to top 3 places of each class
- Open/intermediate division: \$40 per class with 50% payback to top 3 places of each class

Contest Rules:

1. No alcoholic beverages allowed at contest grounds
2. No stall jacks, power tools, torches, or benders will be permitted
3. All shoes are property of the scholarship fund
4. Free-standing stations only for all classes
5. 1 forge and anvil, and 1 set of tools will be used for two-man class
6. Specimen shoes will be available for all classes
7. Abuse or unprofessional behavior will be grounds for dismissal and entries fees will be forfeited
8. If a condition arises making a horse lame, competitor will be disqualified
9. All shoes should be submitted with a suitable nail
10. Judge's decisions are final
